

Adding YouTube videos to a web page

Step 1: Find your video on YouTube.

Step 2: Click the *Share* button below the video. Then click *Embed*.

Step 3: Copy the text in the *Embed* block: click in the block, and then click on *Edit* and drag down to *Copy* (or hold down the Control key and press the letter 'C' on Windows computers).



It will look like this:

Now paste this code in the HTML for your page. In *SeaMonkey*, click the *HTML Source* tag, locate the spot you want to show the video, then paste (Edit -> Paste, or Control+P) the code. The video will not show in your page as you are editing it, however. Start a browser and open the page to see it. Consider a table with one row and one column in which to put your video.



You can make some changes in the appearance of the video. Scroll down below the embed code to select your preferences.
